

# Guidelines for Printed Poster Presentations

There will be a poster session during the IHC 2022. During a poster session, presenting author must be available at their poster. The presenter should be prepared to provide a three minutes' pitch of his/her poster presentation.

## Practical information

- Poster content should be well organized for clear presentation.
- The size of the poster should not exceed A0 (119 cm in height × 84 cm in width).
- Each poster presenter will affix his or her poster to a designated wall. Setting up poster is presenter's duty.
- Poster presenter must consider that they are responsible for printing and bringing the poster to the Conference.

## Content of the poster

- Make sure paper's title is prominently displayed at the top of the poster so that viewers can quickly recognise it.
- Indicate name(s) of the author(s) and email address of corresponding author (i.e., poster presenter).
- The title of your poster must match the title of the abstract you submitted.
- The poster presenter should include a photo of himself or herself on the poster so that he or she can be identified.
- Emphasize the author's name and contact information in case the audience wants to get in touch with him or her for more information.
- Prepare all diagrams or charts neatly and legibly, in a size that can be read from 1.5–2.0 metres away.
- Use a variety of font sizes and styles, as well as colour, and double-space all of your text. For each line or bar in your graph or chart, use a different colour or texture.
- Arrange the information on the poster in a clear, orderly, and self-explanatory manner.
- Include the background of your research, followed by methodology, results and conclusions.

## Poster evaluation

- A successful poster presentation depends on how well you convey the information to an interested audience.
- Poster entries will be evaluated on content and presentation.
- Judges will make top three selections based on the quality of research, poster's layout, presenter's delivery, understanding of work, and response to questions.
